

	Task 1	Task 2
Monday	Find items around your home to role play a shop. Put prices on the and practise using money, either pretend or real to buy your items.	Write out the numbers 0-20 on some paper or card, cut them up and then ask a grown-up to mix the numbers up – don't peek! Then, see how quickly you can put them into the correct order. You could ask someone to time you and then see if you can get faster when you try again. Make it harder, write out the numbers 20-30, or 50-60 etc.

	Task 1	Task 2
Tuesday	Use some recycles objects to build a robot. What 3D shapes have you used? What 2D shape faces can you see? How many vertices on the shape (pointy corners) can you see? How many edges can you see?	There are 22 footballers on a field and half of them are wearing red. How many footballers are in red? Draw 22 T-shirts and colour half in red to check. Can you design your own North Mead football shirt? We would love to see it.

	Task 1	Task 2
Wednesday	There are 6 people on a bus. Then, 2 more people get on. How many people are on the bus altogether? Try drawing a picture to help you work out the answer.	Ask the children to think of any 2 numbers which add up to make 10, for example 5 and 5, 4 and 6. Can they write it as a number sentence, using the correct signs. How many different ways can they find? Begin by writing them all, 10+0=10 9+1=10 8+2=10 7+3=10 Etc. Can they spot the pattern?? These are called number bonds to 10.
th	Can you write this as a number sentence? For example using the mathematical signs + and =. Can you role play your own bus, like we have done in maths,	
	and write your own number sentences to show the maths?
